MATHEMATICS INSTRUCTION

Small Group Mathematics for Students Entering Grades 1-6

The program runs for approximately 5 weeks and provides about 27 hours of differentiated instruction over 18 days featuring online games, IXL, ST Math, small group instruction, explorations and more.

Attention Students Entering Pine Brook or MEMS Small Group ELA or Mathematics Courses for Students Entering Grades 6-7

Small Group English Language Arts (ELA) Course

This class is open to all rising 6th and 7th graders looking for English Language Arts enrichment. The foundation will be laid with many of the related concepts being introduced in this course. This course will focus on determining central ideas and key details, citing textual evidence, identifying an author's point of view or purpose, and vocabulary development.

Small Group Mathematics Course

The foundation will be laid with many of the related concepts being introduced in this course. This course will focus on determining central ideas and key details, citing textual evidence, identifying an author's point of view or purpose, and vocabulary development.

Small Group Mathematics Course

Rational and linear exponents, ratios, and proportions, and simple to complex equations will be introduced.

Reading, Writing, and Math, Oh My! for Students entering Grades 1-3 & 4-6

Students will maintain and further develop their skills as related to word work, reading, writing, and mathematics in this center-based community of learning. The course is designed to actively engage students throughout the morning. They will work collaboratively with peers, in small groups, and one-on-one with the teacher(s). Teachers will tap into individual interests, strengths, and needs of each child.

<u>Word Work</u> - Strategy lessons will be conducted to strengthen decoding and encoding skills.
 <u>Reading</u> - Strategy lessons will be conducted to strengthen fluency and comprehension.
 <u>Writing</u> - Students will work on mechanics and the development of ideas when writing.
 <u>Mathematics</u> - Students will sharpen mathematical facts and problem solving skills.

ESL: English as a Second Language for Students Entering Grades 1-8

This is a FREE program for currently identified and eligible ELL students, and it is designed to help our English Language Learners continue to improve within the four strands of language development (listening, speaking, reading, and writing). Students will use online tools, which may include Reading A-Z, LexiaCore5, multicultural stories, poems, and leveled texts. Students will meet in person to practice small group reading strategies, to answer questions, and to engage in listen and comprehension activities. A focus will also be on following directions and growing and enhancing vocabulary.

Be Well! with SEL (Social Emotional Learning) for Students Entering Grades 1-4

This session will provide students with a stress-free environment for growth and expression and the opportunity to strengthen their self esteem by engaging in games and hands-on activities. This class will teaches social and emotional skills that are necessary for life and academic success. Social competencies that may be focused on include responsible decision-making, resiliency, self-awareness, and self-regulation. Additionally, students will learn to apply the skills necessary to understand and manage emotions, to set and achieve positive goals, to feel and show empathy for others, to establish and maintain positive relationships, and to make responsible decisions." Students will benefit from a safe space to learn and grow socially and emotionally!

Mighty Minds for Students Entering Grades 3-6

Mind full or mindful? This course is an interactive exploration into social and emotional learning, specifically with mindfulness techniques. Providing students with mindfulness strategies is important so they can feel empowered and ready to learn, face challenges, and find both calm and strength within themselves. By helping students become aware of and then embody the connection between their emotions, thoughts, and bodily sensations, students are better able to regulate their emotions, which then impacts things such as their behavior, stress levels, relationships, and ability to focus.

In the spirit of adventure, students will be guided through an array of engaging mindfulness techniques which includes work on emotional management and regulation, social problem solving, focus, and attention. Together. they cultivate greater self-awareness which is essential for optimal learning and self-regulation. Techniques and strategies will be playful and adaptable to school and home environments.

Educational research has shown that chess can help lead to improvement on standardized tests for reading and mathematics. Students will have the opportunity daily to read texts of interest and will learn to utilize the media center to deepen their love for literacy -- all while having fun!
