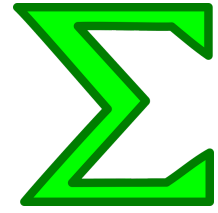


SIGMA COMMUNITY

Sigma Supply List

Mrs. Bergamino (Mathematics): 3 ring binder (2 inch), lined notebook filler paper for the binder, TI-34 multi-view calculator, fine tip dry erase marker, a ruler, plenty of pencils and erasers. To keep at home: graph paper.

Mrs. Mangel (Mathematics): 3 subject spiral notebook with pocket folders (or a 3 ring binder of your choice- with folders and loose leaf paper), TI-34 MultiView calculator, pencils and erasers, personal pencil sharpener, ruler and protractor.
Geometry class only: compass To keep at home (**all classes**): graph paper

Mr. Hackmann (Mathematics): - 3 ring binder (1 inch) with loose leaf paper, 1 sturdy folder, TI-34 MultiView calculator, pencils and erasers, personal pencil sharpener, dry erase marker.

Mrs. Bruno (Language Arts): 3 ring binder (1 inch) with dividers, a sturdy pocket folder, composition notebook, plenty of pencils and erasers.

Mrs. Viteritto (Language Arts): 3 ring binder (1 inch), red pens for edits, highlighters, plenty of pencils, erasers, and blue or black pens, and one pack of each of the following: crayons, colored pencils, markers, Crayola preferred and two glue sticks. These will stay in the classroom to replenish supplies throughout the year. We will be heavy on the "arts" part this year!

Mr. Harris (Language Arts): 3 ring binder (1 inch) with dividers, a sturdy pocket folder, 2 marble composition books, highlighters

Mrs. Carroll (Science): Sturdy pocket folder, colored pencils, sharpie marker (black)

Mrs. Fleishman (Social Studies): 3 ring binder (1 inch) with two packages of dividers and a pencil pouch with ample writing utensils.

NOTE: Students may combine their subjects into one heavy duty binder with dividers if they so choose.

Sigma Community Rules and Discipline

1. Use of lockers will be discussed in September.
2. Students will be required to use the following heading on all written and digital work:

Student's full name

Date

Teacher's name and period number

Assignment

3. It is the student's responsibility to make up all assignments missed during an absence. A study buddy is highly recommended. It is the student's responsibility to contact his/her study-buddies to obtain any missed work. Please note: Teachers do post daily homework assignments and materials on Google Classroom.
4. There will be a penalty for all work handed in late.
5. All students are to be in the classroom on time, ready to work, and remain until dismissed by the teacher.
6. Students must come to class with all necessary materials including the following: pens, pencils, notebook, a charged chromebook, and any textbooks. It is highly recommended for students to purchase an assignment pad to keep track of assignment due dates.
7. There will be no eating of food, candy, or gum chewing permitted in any of the classrooms.
8. Student behavior will be respectful. Inappropriate language and behavior in school will not be tolerated.

Sigma Community DISCIPLINE / BEHAVIOR POLICY

Disciplinary problems that occur will result in the following procedures:

1. Two Community Warnings will result in:
 - *Conference with faculty and student to discuss proactive strategies.*
 - *A follow-up slip will accompany the student home for a parent signature following the conference.*
2. The third consecutive Community Warning will result in:
 - *Phone call home to parents to further discuss student behavior.*
 - *Removal from any community activities for that marking period and possible administrative referral.*
3. The fourth consecutive Community Warning will result in:
 - *Conference with community teachers, student, parent and administrator.*
4. All students will begin with a clean record at the beginning of each marking period.

Community Warnings can be issued for but not limited to the following:

- ✓ Unprepared for class
- ✓ Late to class
- ✓ Disrespectful behavior toward others
- ✓ Misbehaving/distracting other students from learning
- ✓ cheating (via digital or manual)

Please note: Student safety (physical or emotional) is our top priority; therefore, major infractions will result in immediate administration intervention.
